

**Transcript of the video interview between Kellie-Jay Keen and Sherronna Bishop (America's Mom)
(Tab 36)**

Parties: Kellie Jay-Keen (KK), Sherronna Bishop (SB) ('America's Mom')

- 5 SB: Hey everyone. Welcome to America's Mom and today we have an incredible special guest with us today all the way from the UK. She is spending her evening with us here in America in Colorado that is Miss Posey Parker. She is a women's and children's advocate more than an advocate she's a massive activist who has made the mistake of publicly stating that women are women and men are men and men cannot become women and she is going to be joining us here
- 10 in just a moment on America's Mom. I am so stinking excited because it's not every day, it is not every day you get to have a woman **Audio drops out**
- KK: Hello.
- SB: ---excited to have you on here today. You see it happens. Thank you for your great---
- KK: It's so easy.
- 15 SB: Yeah it was so easy, oh my gosh. So Miss Posey Parker welcome to Colorado. I am so excited for everybody to meet you and hear from you. There is so much for you to share with us. First of all I just kind of want to highlight you are a mom.
- KK: I am yes of four.
- SB: Of four and married forever.
- 20 KK: Married forever been together 21 years this month.
- SB: Awesome, awesome. Same here, same here. And so tell me why in the world you decided to be a women's and children's activist. Just take us back to the beginning. What happened, why have you been barred from Twitter, interrogated by the police twice, brought on shows to be hostilely grilled by the media over and over and over? What happened? Tell us about this.
- 25 KK: So I'm a former lefty so back in 2015 we- the Conservative Party, were elected outright in the UK and part of that was a little bit of disgruntled feelings amongst lefty women and so I joined this group and long story short it was supposed to be a women's group and I'd never really heard of some of the issues before and I was attacked quite venomously because I asked a man who looked like a trucker if he really was a woman. And it was it was honestly like I'd said I'd like to
- 30 murder your family because it wasn't just the way he responded which I was really, really shocked it was the way the women responded on his behalf that really unsettled and unnerved me. And I think once I realised that there were certain things that you're not allowed to say that's really all I want to talk about.
- SB: So you're I want to just recap this. You're at a feminist leftist meeting a man is there pretending to be a woman and you say are you a man?
- 35 KK: Online, it's online.
- SB: Okay.
- KK: There's around [?]----
- SB: And they all get, yeah.
- 40 KK: They get mad at me.
- SB: They get mad at you for calling out the obvious okay.
- KK: Mm.
- SB: So things you're not allowed to say in the UK anymore. So what has your life been? What motivate-, was that the starting point for you where you said this is crazy?
- 45 KK: Yeah I think before that I'd sort of assumed that the word transwoman was reserved for transsexuals and I had this idea that a transsexual was a deeply disturbed timid person who found

50 it difficult to go out in the world and was you know just quite a mentally ill person and deluded but also harmless. And I had no idea that what transwoman meant was a man who literally wants to force everybody around him to cooperate in his fantasy or fetish that he is a woman and once I found that that was a thing because it's just insane once I found that was a thing it was something I really couldn't leave and it got very it got a lot worse very, very quickly. So I asked him lefty sort of women's groups you know does my daughter have the right to go into a female only changing room and not see an adult penis and the answer to that right is of course she does. I mean that's the way that's a bridge too far for anyone but no your daughter's transphobic, you've raised your daughter to be a pervert if she's concerned about genitals and just why are you raising a family of bigots.

55 SB: Oh my gosh.

KK: So that was the response.

60 SB: Tell me about the real straw that broke the camels back for you the billboard. What did you do in the UK that made everybody lose their ever loving minds? Tell me I mean did you do a big billboard that said gays or trans transgenders are going to hell? Did you like put up a big picture of people being having been mutilated after surgery? What did you do that caused such an uproar?

KK: Well I'll show you. I don't know if you need some sort of warning for your viewers.

65 SB: Oh yes I---

70 KK: I'm sorry if anyone's offended but that's what I put. Let's see if I can get the light off that. That's what I put on the billboard. So it's the dictionary definition of woman. It may as well have said death to all transwomen because that had, I think the fundamental thing that's the most alarming about this probably more than if I'd put death to transwomen is that this is a neutral objective truth and so that is far more threatening to the transgender ideology than if I'd said let's kill all trans people I think.

75 SB: That's pretty incredible. I've seen people, I've watched the interviews that you've done with your morning talk shows over there and the hostility that you face for implying that women may not be safe with men in their spaces tell me about that. Why is that such a, why are they freaked out about that?

80 KK: Well I used to be a feminist and so I would I, if I go back to those arguments it's kind of a sexism that's a little bit deeper than a sexism. It's a, so for all of us we are raised in a society and a culture and actually our brains are wired from puberty onwards to have I guess we might call it modesty but there is an embarrassment factor to the way we feel about ourselves and our bodies from about you know it's a global phenomenon. It's not just in some countries and obviously that sort of level of nudity will depend on whatever culture but it's not good enough for these men to dress like women. I think part of their whole, part of their whole identity actually requires them to make women feel uncomfortable. So it's about constantly breaking our boundaries and I've got some other sinister ideas about why that is for part of the movement. That actually, that what mothers do, and also what women do, is we are the, we are the gatekeeper to children's safety. And so I think if you can undermine our protections especially what you're doing with the sort of schools. And we've just had here, that they're going to teach 6 year olds about touching themselves. I mean, I'm smiling, but it does really make me feel quite- I mean if someone did that to my 6 year old, I can't say that I'd be polite about that at all.

90 SB: No.

95 KK: But, so the women's spaces, we don't actually have any laws, and I don't think you do in America, that a man's not allowed to go in a women's toilet. But it's pretty much how society is arranged that you don't go into women's toilets and changing rooms. You don't apply for women's bursaries because you have like big money deals in America if you can get onto a scholarship for girls' sports or whatever.

SB: Absolutely.

KK You know, it's just mad that--you wouldn't have to put in the, you wouldn't have to put in the college bursary application for female sport that the person actually has to be female and what female means because it's been a given that we all know that.

100 SB: Absolutely. Why, what do you think, so you said that you think that there is a stripping away of the identity of women because we're the gatekeepers to children?

KK: Yeah.

SB: So are you implying that you think they're trying to do this in order to remove women out of the way, we're too busy being polite and trying to be welcoming to everyone and be nice so that they have easier access to our kids?

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KK: Well I think that's part of it. Like we had a really big thing over here in the 1970s 80s and 90s where sort of liberal in the sense of accepting liberals I guess the normal sense of liberal, they got really coerced and manipulated into this notion that actually the only thing that was wrong with paedophilia was the shame that children felt and so we had people trying to change the laws of consent. Now what they were doing is they were on our BBC, I'm gonna call them normal, I don't mean normal but paedophiles kind of presenting as normal human beings, not disturbed evil men and they are mostly men and they would sort of talk about kindness to children and how children have agency and there's all these sort of words being used by trans lobby groups to try and well you have some terrible things that are going on with your children in transing, we don't quite have that because we do have our healthcare is, for a start it's less money-oriented because it's State-funded so we don't have hospitals, we don't have Olsen Kennedy giving eight year olds testosterone like you do in the States, you can't get a double mastectomy until you're 18 you know and you can have it at 13 I think in Oregon you can do it 15 without---

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SB: Yeah.

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KK: ---your parents' consent.

SB: Yeah.

KK: So we don't have those sorts of things but there's very similar language that was used to normalise and try and coerce the general public into accepting paedophilia and that's the same sort of stuff as consent and agency and all these little words that you hear when we talk about mutilating children's bodies.

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SB: I want you to talk about that for a minute because when it came to comprehensive sex education which is a springboard into allowing all types of lifestyles including paedophilia I'm waiting for bestiality, I don't know what else is coming, polyamorous or whatever where you've got multiple partners. Tell me about that word consent. What is it about saying free agency and consent where we're applying it to eight year olds, what is this? When I'm talking to superintendents and they're telling me "you don't think consent matters?" and I'm thinking we've always had no. People have always been able to say no. Why are they using these words consent and free agency, what is this about?

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KK: I think the main reason they're using these words, if you are a manipulative paedophile and your main goal is to get to children and you know I've read some of the stuff that goes on in Hollywood, I've seen some quite disturbing videos of like Leonardo DiCaprio with an agent when he's about 16 and there's far too much sort of touching and lingering.

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SB: So that man was actually prosecuted as a paedophile. He was prosecuted for molesting children yeah.

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KK: Who knew that a man that had far too much to do with teenage boys was gonna turn out to be a child rapist? But if your goal, I mean I talk about the Catholic Church and I don't mean to cast aspersions on Catholics at all but I'm saying that there were men that gave their lives apparently to God and spent their whole life in the priesthood just to have access to rape children. So if a man can do that why can't loads of them get together in an organisation to try and coerce society and get rid of some of our safeguardings? I think it's the very least they would do—and this language switch, so I talk about pronouns I don't use preferred pronouns if you're a man you're a man and you get he and you don't mess with my language it's none of your business how I speak. But you will even get intellectuals like Douglas Murray over here and these men that really understand the issues that men cannot be women that out of politeness will say she and that slight switch it's very difficult then to say why is she using the women's toilets whereas if you stick to he for a man you can very clearly say why is he in the women's toilets but they're just these tiny little changes of language. So consent, if we talk about agency and consent and we've talked about that a lot and I agree with the whole consent rules I agree with the lack of capacity to

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155 consent but that's it that's where it ends for me. Children do have the lack of capacity to consent to body changes to medicine and to sex.

SB: Tell me about your, you did a video, since we're kind of moving into children a little bit more you did a video showing Dr Wilburly, am I saying it right Dr Wilburly. I was really shocked and appalled. I put that video up on America's Mom I wanted everyone to see that 'cause they need to understand what we are talking about when we are talking about children transitioning. Walk us through the process of a child who goes through the transition from being a born, let's just do a female to male. Walk us through---

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KK: Okay. So female to male I think number one the impetus and the motivations are very different. I think it's quite easy it's quite difficult in our very sexualised society if you don't want to join in on the kind of pretty boy interested sexualised version of female then you the only way you can really escape that with being a lesser female is to transition to male or rather one of the ways unless you're very resilient I think and especially if you're a lesbian youth. So the first thing you do is you go along and you socially transition and we know that once you socially transition once you decide that your name is Robert instead of Rebecca and you socially transition then the likelihood of you moving on to a medical transition is extraordinarily high. So when these parents of three and four year olds who are insane and I think they've got Munchausen's by proxy but that's another issue when those parents take that child and socially transition them they basically start them on the journey. Then you've got puberty blockers. Puberty blockers are said to be reversible they are not. There is no data to say that they are reversible at all anywhere in the world even with some of these very dodgy studies that have been done with lots of trans lobby money they don't even have any long term data that says it's reversible. So that's number one. Number two you may breast bind so if you've missed the boat and you've already got your breasts then you breast bind. That can cause like cracked ribs, breathing difficulties, you can't do PE like sports. You can't, on a hot day you have to be careful. You can't, you sort of feel well I mean I don't know about you but I think these mothers that go along with that they should have to wear a binder for a week before they allow their daughter to wear one because I don't think it matters if you've got ample breasts or not anything doing that for an entire day I think it would make most of us probably want to throw up.

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SB: Absolutely, yeah.

KK: So then after you do, I didn't really need to do the visual I guess but I have---

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SB: It's just you can feel this, you can---

KK: ---[?] feels like.

SB: Yes you can start to feel how this is so suffocating.

KK: Yeah it's insane. Then you have testosterone. Now in the United States because your healthcare system I think is flooded with money and people wanting to make money out of it and I'll just digress slightly. So Lupron which is one of your main puberty blockers was used in men with prostate cancer and if you just Google prostate cancer Lupron, Lupron Scandal L-U-P-R-O-N you will find men that died of heart failure before the prostate cancer killed them. Now these will be men in their 70s and 80s which basically they could just live with the prostate cancer until they die because cancer grows very slowly in old men and yet I think there were some doctors they made like \$1.6 million kickbacks from drug companies to give Lupron whatever where they knew it wasn't needed so that's that. So we know that medical scandals happen. Testosterone what that does is eventually, well first of all it gives them acne and it gives them vaginal atrophy which is like the menopause. So deep inside you everything just loses any moisture. If this is too graphic I'll stop.

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SB: No tell it like people do not understand. It's one thing to be like just be nice leave them alone when you're dealing with parents of these kids who are not understanding what is all involved so no please.

KK: So that, so vaginal atrophy will cause. so when the body reaches a high point shall we say if I'm being euphemistic when the body reaches a high point everything contracts and then it releases right. That's what most women experience generally in that area when we're intimate.

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SB: You're so polite. You're talking about an orgasm is that what you're talking about?

KK: I'm talking about an orgasm.

SB: Yes okay.

210 KK: So it all contracts and then it releases. Well when you have atrophy it doesn't release so will have that intense contraction for can be days. Now the only way to escape that sort of agony is to have a hysterectomy. So these are women in their early, so in their teens they're going through the menopause and in their early 20s they're having to have hysterectomies and a hysterectomy then increases your chance of osteoporosis, cancer and now they've discovered Alzheimer's. So the earlier your menopause your natural menopause the more likely you have the greater risk of
215 Alzheimer's and if you do it earlier because who knew I mean whether you're religious or whether you believe in evolution or somewhere in between whatever happened to our bodies to make them like they work it's very well done. You know as far as I'm concerned it took a millennia to craft and change and you know and I think most of us think our bodies work pretty well I've grown four humans in mine.

220 SB: They're amazing.

KK: So that's where we are really. We're taking and for what, for a child to feel a little more comfortable because there's this crazy social contagion which, there's a lady called Jennifer Bilek who's written for the Federalists I think, her surname is B-I-L-E-K and she's written Where the Money Is and it's her belief and I'm inclined to agree with her somewhat, her belief is this is all about creating lifelong medical patients because once you have that hysterectomy you have to
225 keep taking these hormones, you know whichever way you go then that's it, forever you are hooked on these drugs to make you something that you'll never really be. Then of course you've got the other surgeries so you've got the double mastectomy which often doesn't even cure the dysphoria because they can't cut the entire breast off because then you'd have like a concave chest so they leave some of the breast tissue which still moves and still behaves like breast tissue. So that's one thing so it doesn't really cure that anyway. And then the other thing is creating a pretend penis where they move the flesh of the arm they create a tubular prosthetic that doesn't really work. They sew it on. There are stories of like celebratory stories, so these aren't scary stories these are I feel so brave with a lot of people going oh my God you're so brave
230 it's so wonderful. 30 corrective surgeries after having a phalloplasty and one of the complications was she urinated through her anus and had a bag and then had another---

SB: And you will never---

KK: ---corrective surgery---

240 SB: You will never ever hear this stuff on the main media ever. I've never heard that. I've never heard this talked about before ever, ever. That is horrifying.

KK: It's properly kind of, who's the monster, it's proper Frankenstein stuff.

SB: Yeah.

KK: So you've got, so that's not uncommon to have these corrective surgeries. There are some surgeons that make a pretty penny out of corrective surgeries.

245 SB: Wow.

KK: You know there's, I think it costs quarter of a million dollars to go from male to female.

SB: And you may never, so in our military we had the Trump administration had said no more transgenders in the military. Why? A lot of it was cost and expense. We are paying for the surgeries, we're paying for the hormone treatment, we're paying for the ongoing need as you stated ongoing need for those medications and hormones and that's not fair to the taxpayers.
250 There's a lot of responsibility and obligation that comes with that. It's not a they're less human thing it's this is an a massive exorbitant cost to maintain your---

KK: They're practically---

SB: ---hormones.

255 KK: They're practically disabled. The men that have their penis inverted what often happens, well what happens with the girls with the phalloplasty is they often get necrosis so their skin their flesh

dies and then they have to have another skin graft. So they'll replace the arm flesh with the square from like a six inch square from the thigh. Often both of those things fail and so then they have another surgery and another surgery to try and you know it---

260 SB: Create something.

KK: You can't do these things. We can't, we can, what made anybody think that we can genuinely change a man into a woman. It's ridiculous. It's, I don't believe that any surgeon genuinely believes they can do it. I just think they just see dollars.

265 SB: Absolutely and keep going. You, so one of the things so besides the obvious parts of women being at risk with men being in their spaces I've heard I've watched several lesbian women talk about this how you know their spaces are being invaded. I didn't expect that. Why is it do you think that a lot of people in the LBGQ community are believing that they need to accept transgender as a viable lifestyle. Why are they doing that. It's been assumed that they're just a part of the group even though we know it's gender dysmorph-, just gender dysphoria. The Johns Hopkins University they were the first to create this sex change operation. They no longer do the sex change operation---

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KK: Yeah.

275 SB: ---because they found after 20 years of research it does nothing to heal that person and their motto is do no harm. So if they have the same suicide rates and in fact have worse depression afterwards. They then said we're not going to continue to do this. So why are we, why are, what do you think the obligation is there to unite gender dysphoria with them?

280 KK: I think they've been coopted. So I think the first transsexuals the first men were probably really effeminate homosexual men and I think that that's how they got enveloped and cushioned in. It wasn't heterosexual men which it predominantly is now it's men in dresses who get a kick out of wearing a dress and forcing their wives who we call trans widows into this life.

SB: We are going to talk about that.

285 KK: So I think that they've occupied these spaces long before they turned into tyrants and I think it's been a, I think there's a guy called Matthew Paris in the UK who was a gay rights campaigner who admits that what they did is they would get together and they would decide to infiltrate. And I'm now I'm going to say something that's not linked but with the paedophile information exchange when they wanted to change our society what they did is they got themselves into positions of influence. So that's what, that's why every time you think well Planned Parenthood they won't although I think that's such a dodgy organisation I can't tell you and I'm pro choice but what's happened is that they've now got people on the board and any voices of dissent just get kicked out. So then you can't. So there's a ground there's a big swell of lesbians have been talking about this for a lot longer than gay men. Gay men are just about cottoning onto it now because why does why do gay men care who don't have families why do they care predominantly about women and girls. They don't care, they don't care about us and it's only women and girls like who cares about us.

295 SB: Wow.

300 KK: So I think my, Magdalen Berns is a lesbian who passed away actually last week of a brain tumour. It was terrible she was 36 but she's got some really good videos which talk about how this has happened. So most lesbian groups they you know the women don't have lesbian bars anymore because these men just used to go in because the greatest validation for a heterosexual man to say he's a woman is to force a lesbian to say that he's a woman and have him as a sexual partner. I mean it's just, I think that the backlash is coming but there's a lot of young people young lesbians even that think part of their sexuality has to be to accept someone with a penis.

305 SB: Yeah, I've had a lot of messages about that recently because we've been reading these children's books that are trying to link all of these groups together and my thought with that is it's just a matter of time before paedophilia is right there in with and they've already been trying we already know that. I can't agree more with your idea that if they can remove the gatekeepers, I haven't heard it said quite that way though, that was really, this is so fascinating. As we here in America we'll hear these stories of you know living their truth and you've got a man that comes out as a transgender woman and leaves his wife and his children, talk to, I had not heard this side of things before. I think everyone will find this very fascinating. There is just a wake of heartache and

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disaster that follows a transgender person and whether they're legitimate or doing what you're talking about where they're just getting a kick of acting like they might be female but really this is kind of a bizarre fetish but tell me about this whole, tell our audience about this trans women widowhood. I had never heard this and I---

315 KK: Okay.

SB: ---we don't talk about this stuff in America, it's only live your dream follow your---

KK: No you don't.

SB: ---desires.

320 KK: It's so insane. Oh you're born in the wrong body, as if that could, is a possibility that you know if you're religious how could you possibly believe God made such a mistake and if you're not religious how can you believe in something with no evidence whatsoever. But what happens is these men when they get to a certain age and goodness knows I wish they could afford a Porsche instead but I think they've watched too much porn basically and what a lot of these men want is they don't want to change their bodies they don't have dysphoria they don't have that at all in fact
325 I'm, I think probably maybe 1% of the trans community may have something like dysphoria but I don't really believe it. So you have these men that decide that they want breasts they don't want to lose their penis they just want a breast or two and probably two. So they fall in love with themselves as women, that's what happens to them. So you'll hear these very common stories of these men taking lots of selfies of themselves in their new gear, of bankrupting the family,
330 spending so much money on wigs, not wanting to be intimate with their wives anymore although to be frank if my husband even hinted at anything like this he'd be out of the door quicker than he could find a wig. It just, I think---

SB: Thank you for saying that.

KK: ---my husband---

335 SB: Thank you for saying that---

KK: ---[?].

SB: we've gotta stop tolerating this nonsense women, stop, stop.

340 KK: What if he stood, the thing is I love my children unconditionally but I love my husband in a very conditional manner. You know it's a proper I fell in love with him for a whatever reason and if those reasons cease to exist no I won't love him anymore. I've got far too much self respect and I'm not a bystander in my husband's life I'm his wife and we have a partnership. I can't think of anything more revolting plus he's quite a blokey bloke he's quite a masculine man. He would look hideous as a woman.

SB: He wouldn't make a good girl is that what you're saying?

345 KK: Oh my God he'd just look so awful. So that's what happens and I think that this is, we've got a new thing in this country called coercive control where men basically gaslight their wives and their wives have very little control in their lives and I think that it's obscene abuse to make your wife pretend 24 hours a day that she thinks you're female. I think it's quite a revolting abuse and I also think that these men, and it's predominantly men, you don't hear heterosexual women suddenly
350 wanting to remove their breasts and be called Brian, you know it does happen but I think it's extraordinarily rare and I think it's happened to a boy, he transitioned in the US that his mother did it and I think she was just quite (a) he was the youngest of, there were three girls I think and then him so I think that was something to do with the boy getting changed and he was wearing makeup and sort of dressing like a 30 year old woman when he was 11 and I think his mother quite liked
355 the attention of all that and that's how I think she got into thinking that maybe she was a boy after all after being like a stay at home mum with long hair and very feminine. So you don't hear of women doing it and I just think that for these men it's just this ultimate fetish and I would say to any woman even if what you want to do is you want to support your husband and you have no self-respect or self-esteem left and you think that your marriage can cope with it, for God's sake
360 protect your finances, just protect them, even if he never leaves or you never leave him know your rights, know where your bills are paid, know what your finances are, know whether your name's on the mortgage, just do everything you can to protect your assets because as far as I'm

365 concerned the first time he tells you that he wants to be dressing as a woman he's probably been doing it for ten years behind your back and then it will be a really short time before you become an invisible player in your marriage and it will just all be about him. And it's absolutely dreadful and these women then feel that they have to constantly affirm their husband as women and it's very frightening, I just, I just think just tie up, kick him out, get rid, take everything he's got, would be my advice.

370 SB: I find it amusing, I have not heard about trans women whether it was before or even had considered that devastation that is happening all around so I wanna honour your time, you have been so amazing with me today. I want to take us back to kids for just a minute and what you guys are viewing over there in the UK, what you're watching happen here in America, what do you think about this push, this push to have little drag boys dressed in drag dancing on stages for grown men, mothers going along with this and acting like you know it's just part of their artisticness and their personality and they're just letting their personality there, how do you guys look at America in light of this situation, this transgender weird sexualisation of kids that we are literally fostering, we're paying our tax dollars now through comprehensive sex-ed to sexualise our kids, what do you guys think about that when you're looking at America?

380 KK: Well I'd like to say that I look at you from this moral high ground that the UK has but we don't because we're doing the same. But you're a little bit further on. I think you're far more spread out so any of your pushback is a lot more difficult and I think that just very quickly I think what you need to do as US women is and the women on the right do this very good they do it well to stick to an issue whereas women on the left like everybody to agree with everything they've ever uttered before they'll work together. But this has to be pushed aside. You have to unite as women and you have to not use a religious exemption but you have to contact your senators and your representatives and you have to oppose the Equality Act. Not the whole thing you have to tell your senators that actually what you need to do is you just need to take out the gender identity. It's never going to work if you try and oppose lesbians and gays not being, and I don't know on what in what space or what grounds you would anyone would want to do this anyway. I don't think a man should make a cake saying I love gay marriage by the way I think that's a freedom of expression issue but when it comes to, you have to oppose it on the basis of (a) the law won't make sense because if anyone can be a woman then woman ceases to exist in law and you have to stick to that, just that gender identity thing it's really, really important. When it comes to kids in the United States I think, I don't know how you're gonna push back this tide. I think it is, I think it's paedophilia. I think it's a lot of and it's mums that go along with it. It's dads that ruin their families by pretending to be women but it's mothers that go along with the mutilation of their own children. And I have no idea why women do that. I think maybe they're over-empathetic with their children and they listen to their kids far too much. I'm my child's parent I don't need to be their friends. They've got friends. If they want someone to validate and tell them that everything they say is right then they can find a girlfriend or a boyfriend to do that. That's not my place. My place is to think about my children and how they're going to feel in 5 and 10 and 15 years time and treat them like a work in progress not that they have any idea in what they're doing.

SB: Absolutely.

405 KK: The drag queen thing there's some really good pushback with the drag queens and what they've done is they've made it, so what they do is they protest wherever the drag queen story time nonsense is and they protest and they make it too difficult for the libraries to actually put on that event. So that's a really good method. You just you only need about 5, 10 people to go and say we're not having this drag queen reading to our small children in a library that's a public place. And also what you have in America is you have free access to meeting rooms in your library and they're not allowed to refuse you because it's a State funded building and they have to uphold free speech and the freedom of expression. So that is a really good place to try and have meetings and the library because it's a State building they have to protect you in there. So you don't have to sort of get security but with, when you protest the library to stop drag queen story time you'll get a lot of the transactivists coming to protest you and then the library don't want anything to do with it 'cause it's far too much hassle.

SB: That makes sense.

420 KK: So that's quite a good way of doing that. As for drag queen story, the drag kids I think these are just women who have achieved nothing in their lives and are trying to get some sort of validation that they're not nothing by pushing their kids forward and I think they're abusers fundamentally. Anyone that takes their child to pose with a nude adult male or in a gay adult club to have money

thrown at them, anyone that doesn't see that as abuse is probably a little bit dodgy and any woman that's doing that to her children probably shouldn't have had them.

SB: I love you. You speak the truth you tell the truth. It's costing you a lot. What's your situation like right now? I saw that your---

425 KK: [?]-

SB: ---children have been doxxed.

KK: Mm-hm yeah. I've been interviewed twice by the police, both times at the behest of Mermaids agenda and what Mermaids did they reported me to the police. The police accessed my data via Twitter. This was when we still had jihadis on Twitter that the police didn't touch.

430 SB: That they didn't touch.

KK: But no they didn't. It's and then they phoned me I had to go in to be interviewed under caution twice. I just got a death threat this evening that was, but I think it's just a nonsense one but it was someone saying that there should be a contract out on my life.

SB: Yes.

435 KK: But I'm not stopping and I live down a long driveway and I've often thought if somebody came to my house I would kill them. You know if anybody literally came to threaten my family I would, that I don't think you could stop me for, it would have to be utensils because we don't have guns. It would have to be---

SB: Well I was gonna say---

440 KK: ---find things---

SB: Girl that's why we have the Second here. I wish you guys had the Second but you don't. And you're right you have the right to defend your family. And I just want to wrap this up. Tell American Moms what do American Moms need to do? I mean, you're you are in a much more refined environment. You have far more restrictions than we do here in America. Tell American
445 Moms what they need to do for their kids to protect them.

KK: Well two things you need to go to your school board meetings because anytime there's a little bit of pushback I understand that transactivists get together. So I've watched a hearing where a 12 year old girl said I want to be able to go in a girl's changing room without a male and a 16 or 17 year old boy who said he was a girl also testified and he won. So you need to be at your school
450 board meetings. If you're in Washington you have direct access to your representatives, you can go in to the what is it or the massive building.

SB: Our Congress aha?

KK: Yeah. You can go in and you can have a five minute pitch at anybody in that entire building. So that's something you need to do. There are organisations there's Hands Across The Aisle and which is a non partisan group and there's also a more of a left wing feminist group called WoLF the Women's Liberation Front. They are both working on your behalf. The Women's Liberation Front are just about to try and test what the word woman means in law with a case about a funeral parlour that didn't want a man that said he was a woman working there because what do grieving relatives want not a man in a dress when they're just about to talk about burying one of their loved ones. It's insane. So what they're going to do is what the transactivists have been doing which is you take a small piece of law and you implant a solid bit of legislation in it by, so the transactivists have changed the word gender and gender identity. They've slipped it into loads of your bills now. So if you have a critical mass where it's said so many times that gender identity is in place of sex then that becomes an easy precedent for them to use in the future. So go to your school
460 board meetings, support the women like yourself who are doing something about it, don't take no for an answer, do protest outside your school gates. Make it difficult for anybody that's trying to take your children's rights away. Support Save Women's Sports or Save Our Sports.

465 SB: Mm-hm.

KK: She's doing some fabulous work and she's representing some of the athletes like the female athletes that have lost out to these boys pretending to be girls. So I think---
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SB: Most of our---

KK: ---that's all you can do.

SB: ---college scholarships. I mean it's insane. They're losing their scholarships to obvious boys who couldn't compete in the boys world.

475 KK: Yeah.

SB: It's, I just, you know listening to you I was so relieved. I was like okay all sanity has not been lost. There is reason still and I love, I think one of the things I love about you also is that you're like you said you're not coming from a moral position you're coming from this is just the facts of our existence. We have men and women and that's that. And I just can't tell you---

480 KK: Can I just say I think you need to, I think to be really honest I think Americans you need to up your game. I think you've tried. I mean you have a really thriving abortion debate in America and the reason you have that thriving abortion debate is because people feel strongly enough about it to get out on the streets and to use graphic imagery and to be really, really active about it the same as when your gun laws like we don't understand gun ownership in the UK, we live right next door to each other for a start and we haven't we've had tyrannical governments I'm sure but it's not the same and we don't have the history of gun ownership so it's we don't understand your gun ownership stuff. I'm beginning to but we don't.

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SB: When you come here we'll take you out. We'll take you out.

490 KK: But oh there's also the Kelsey Coalition. They are amazing. They're a group of many of those women have lost their children to this cult and I met them at their Heritage Foundation and they did gave a talk. In fact there's a Heritage Foundation talk soon. I recently protested outside of Stonewall which is like our version of HRC. It's basically supposed to be a lesbian and gay rights movement that's been totally taken over by trans and what we did is we stood outside with one and a half metres, so sort of five feet six feet high pictures of the phalloplasty what it does to the arm of a double mastectomy. Often they don't have nipples when they have their double mastectomy because the nipple often dies when you do any sort of breast work. So we stood outside with those pictures. I don't see why Americans wouldn't be stood outside of the hospitals that are doing the double mastectomies on teens with massive placards, take out some billboards, you know do whatever it takes to make sure that the people that are objecting and there will be millions across America that think this is insane but they don't know that there are millions across America who think this is insane. So I've had letters from someone in the middle of America is like I feel I'm losing my entire mind there's nobody I know who thinks this is nonsense. So that's what I would do or go to the school board meeting with these placards you know just up your game, make the press, make it impossible for the press to ignore you. Support Madeline Kerns at the or Cairns at the National Review. She's doing some incredible work and Trump I think. Whatever wherever you are on the political scale I think Americans should know if Hillary had got in you'd be so screwed by now. That's the gender stuff. The gender stuff---

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SB: You're so right. Oh my goodness. Do you all hear her? It's not me saying this. This is her former feminist liberal woman from the UK saying we would be screwed right now if HRC was our President and it's exactly, you're getting so much love right now. We all know it's true. We all know it's true.

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KK: [?].

SB: Thank you for that thank you.

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KK: Maybe have these school policies, I'm not going to go into any of the other stuff but I think you'd, Trump listened to somebody right. He listened to someone about the trans in the military. Now who it is that he was listening to I don't know but some of you must have access to whoever he had whoever had his ear. That's what you need you need to work out who has his ear. He would only need to say two sentences about this whole thing and the whole situation changes for America. So you need more on Fox News. But doesn't he watch Fox & Friends?

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SB: Yeah, he did.

KK: You need a little bit more on that. You need everybody needs to be writing to Tucker Carlson every week who's doing some great work on this and he always speaks his mind and has people on. Steven Crowder he's, he speaks out about this and even Joe Rogan and Dave Rubin.

SB: Mm-hm.

525 KK: So all of these people are talking about it but it just needs, you need the New York Times to talk about it. You need these lefty morons to start talking about it and you know the narratives need to change from the schools. You need to get those books out of the schools but I think now you've lost so much ground that without some really quite like big action and push I don't know how
530 America's going to do it. And everybody and I'm speaking to left wing Americans you need to just remember that the woman next to you whatever her views on anything else first and foremost before the politics she's a woman and that's it that's all you need to know.

SB: Thank you so much. You are so brilliant. You're so beautiful and you are just spot on. Thank you for putting yourself out there and you know God bless you and protect your family as you continue to fight for the reality that only women can be women. Thank you so much Posey you are
535 absolutely a gem. Everybody go follow her find her on YouTube. She's got a new show starting a new podcast starting you're going to want to be on there all the time. Nobody can talk. Don't you just, I want to listen to you all the day because your voice is just so lovely. I love I love. I want to go to talk with an accent after I'm done hearing from you. So thank you so much for your time and for your sincerity in all of this. You're not paid to do this, you're not a paid lobbyist, you're not
540 making millions on this are you that we're unaware of?

KK: Well no.

SB: And if you were good for you. I hope you will I hope you'll be able to profit from re-educating people on foundational truths. So good for you.

KK: Let's hope so. Thank you very much for having me.

545 SB: Thank you friends. We'll talk to you soon we'll have you back on soon. Thank you.

KK: Cheers.

SB: Wow. **Audio drops out** into making something out of nothing and they need to understand what they are in for, what their children are in for. That was incredible. We'll have some highlights after today. Thank you guys all for being patient with us and go find our Posey Parker women and child activist. Remember what she said. Women are the gatekeepers to the children and if
550 they can remove us women from protecting our children and invite other people in which is exactly what we're watching happen in real time. So protect our kids guys. Have a great rest of your day.
