Incident Circumstances & Details

Mr Lehmann left a Top Secret-Codeword classified document uncovered and uncontrolled on a desk within the ministerial suite. Uncleared personnel are present within the suite (though the usual occupant of the desk/intended recipient was offsite - it should be noted she also was not appropriately cleared). The presence of the document was brought to my attention by another (cleared) staff member and I secured the document within a B-class safe. I then proceeded to inform Mr Lehrmann that documents at that classification could not be handled in that manner and offered to provide him with details on appropriate document handling procedures which was declined. Mr Lehrmann then requested I return the document to him in order for him to return it to the originating agency, claiming he had a secure means by which to transport it. Mr Lehrmann was then observed leaving the suite with the document in an opaque plastic folder. Subsequent inquiries determined that the document was hand delivered by Mr Lehrmann to a representative of the originating agency. Mr Lehrmann later documented his actions and my follow up actions in an FOUO email sent from the DPN to the Department of Home Affairs.

Action Taken to Centain and Prevent Recurrence of Incident

Mr Lehrmann has verbally confirmed that he holds no other material classified to this level. A whole of office document audit is planned to occur within the next week and the newly established CDR will be fully completed following this audit.

Damage Assessment/Degree of Compromise resulting from Incident

The immediate damage in this case was contained as although there was the potential for uncleared personnel to have viewed the document, it is unlikely that this occurred. It may be prudent for Mr Lehrmann to be reminded of classified document handling procedures to reduce the likelihood of a recurrence.
